Division Challenges, Issues & Solutions

• Pathways has been identified as an area to strengthen within Clubs hence creating a Pathways Workshop on 10th of August to ensure Base Camp Managers are competent and confident in their role to support their fellow club members on their Pathways journeys and contribute to increasing Pathways Adoption Rates within their respective club. Average Pathways Adoption Rates at 25th of July are Club: 69%, New Member: 62% and Officer 91% which will be encouraged to improve further with ongoing Pathways learning via Workshop, Webinar and Club Educational.
