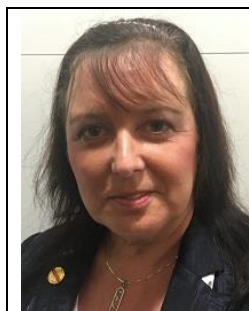

Reformation / Realignment: Authority

On 5 April 2017, Toastmasters International advised that reformation of District 72 into two districts had been approved. District numbers 72 (with the oldest club) and 112 were allocated, effective 1 July 2018. The District Realignment Committee was scheduled to report to the November District Executive / District Council. The Committee was not able to finalise its task following publication of the Draft Realignment Report in August 2017.

However, in its Draft Report the committee identified fourteen divisions. On Friday 10 November the committee confirmed the number of divisions as fourteen, with possible adjustment to Division boundaries. It also confirmed the current G5 Area would remain in a South Island Division, not be part of a Wellington based Division, as proposed in the draft report. To enable the District Leadership Committees to carry out their task, the District Director then determined that in the interim, the Divisions be named 1 to 14 from North to South - (1 to 8 in District 112) and (9 to 14 in District 72).

A Notice of Motion was tabled at the November 2017 D72 Executive & District Council meetings to confirm the number of Divisions (and approximate boundaries), to be voted on at the May 2018 meetings. The District Realignment Committee Final Report is due in March, 2018.
