If we want growth, we need to search out projects and roles that are new to us and encourage others to do likewise. In order to climb the tree, we must let go of the lower branches. We are never 'ready' for these challenges. The growth is in saying yes and having a go.

Final Thought

Bob Dylan conducted a tour in the 1970s. He went on stage wearing white make-up, like a mask. When asked why, he said this is about truth and people tell the truth more often when they wear a mask.

We may not want to give people a mask but we can achieve the same outcome by giving them permission. Speech evaluators, general evaluators and Table Topics evaluators all have unspoken permission to give us feedback inside the club but, when we venture outside the club, we arguably need it more. If organising an event, delivering training, presenting at work, give people permission to help them help you.
