District Officer training was held from 3-4 July and we are happy to report it was a huge success! The incoming Area Directors and other District Officers brought new life to those members of the District Team who are returning in new roles this year. While it was a very intensive and full weekend, including the first DEC Meeting of the new year, we also managed to have a lot of fun.

July District Executive Meeting

The District Executive held its first meeting on the 4 July. As many of you are aware, they had to decide whether the District would be holding in-person or online contests this year. The District Executive voted for in-person contests.

This means all contests must be held in-person from Area level and above.

Please be AWARE!

If one Area or Division ends up going online because of a lockdown situation and cannot postpone till after the lockdown is over, then from that moment on, all other contests within the District must move onto the online platform regardless of whether the other Areas, Divisions are also in lockdown.

For example, if Wellington goes into lockdown and one of their contests is held online, then all other regions, including the District Finals, must go online. We hope that this would be a last resort and we will do our best to work with Areas and Divisions in the event that they are affected by COVID.

Motion 1: To Reduce to 3 Contests

During the District Executive Meeting, the District Director withdrew the motion to remove the Humorous contest from this year's roster.

This was done because of several technicalities with the motion. If it passed, it would then have to go to the District Council Meeting in September. This would mean that those Divisions who want to hold two Division Conferences would only have about a month to get all their club contests and Area contests completed. For the Trio, it became clear that this would put too much pressure on the Area and Division Directors.

This motion also highlighted differences between our District Procedures and the Toastmasters Governing Documents, which need to be reviewed.



The Year Ahead

COVID is still casting its shadow over the world, but hopefully it will not have a huge presence in our year. However, if it does, we will adapt as best we can to each situation as it arises and communicate those decisions to the wider District.

This year, our focus is on member **Retention**. This is Important, as we need the current members to help with the rebuilding of those clubs that have struggled with low membership.

Leadership is also something we are going to focus on. During the course of last year, it became apparent that we have a wide gap of knowledge between the clubs and the District and we are trying to find ways to bridge that gap. We are planning to bring leadership Training not only at the club level, but also the District levels.

One thing we are currently investigating is a District Leadership Weekend, which will be open to all members - possibly in November. While primarily designed to teach leadership skills, it is also another opportunity to get the District together in person. We are in the very early stages of this and more information will be forth coming - if we decide it is viable.

The other key focus point is **Teamwork.** As District Director, I outlaid the culture we want to achieve this year at the District level during District Officer Training.

Members working well in a **Team** equals retention. Members signing up for Leadership equals retention, Retention equals more knowledge in the District.
