

DISTRICT LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT FOR DISTRICT 72

The committee interviewed seven candidates throughout the month of February and into early March. Each candidate has self-nominated and was subsequently interviewed by members of the District Leadership Committee. The District Leadership Committee deliberated on Sunday 13th March 2022 and deemed the following candidates to be “eligible” and “qualified” for the role for which they nominated.

Protocol 9.0 requires two Club Growth Director candidates to be nominated. As only one candidate has been nominated, the requirements of Protocol 9.0 have not been met. Therefore, this part of the report will be considered incomplete.
