


Division C Membership at a Glance:



Since April dues membership levels fell to slightly above October 22 figures. This was in part due to the closure of Oamaru Club.

Two clubs are not in good standing - Scarfies Toastmasters & Lunchspeak however these clubs are looking to increase their membership over the next 2-3 months.

District Realignment: Following April club dues Division C now has 15 clubs (down from 17 previously reported with the closure of Taieri and Oamaru clubs) within 4 Areas (C1-4) spread across a large geographical area. Nine of the 15 clubs have 12 or fewer members. It is anticipated with the District realignment Division C will see more clubs within the Division to support its regrowth.

Distinguished club program: over the six month period 25 members across the division completed Pathways levels. This is an increase from the previously reported 14 members to complete levels. Congratulations to all members who have passed their levels.
