

Division C Membership at a Glance:



Membership has increased to 203 since April 2023, showing a total of 17 new members across the division in the last two months (April-June 2023). This year has seen a fluctuation in membership with a slow upward trend over the last couple of months.

At September club dues the division reported two clubs not in good standing (Lunchspeak & Scarfies) however Scarfies now has 8 members and meets the minimum membership for good standing status. Lunchspeak remains at six members.

Distinguished club program: in the last four month period 17 members across the division completed Pathways levels. Of the 17 members one member completed two levels. This again is an increase from the previously reported 14 members to complete levels indicating that more members are getting pathway levels signed off in Basecamp and Pathways. However, the number completing levels is still low and significantly more work needs to be done to increase the number of members achieving education goals.

Congratulations to all members who have passed their levels.

Club Visits R2: 75% of areas reports completed (Areas C1, C2 & C4). C3 no reports completed. The main theme running through club visit reports continues to be increasing membership and marketing clubs. Area Directors report clubs maintain a high level of friendliness, are supportive of each other and visitors, achievements are acknowledged. More members are taking up Pathways. Suggestions were around:

- Encouraging current members to attend club meetings as those clubs with small numbers often members need to double up on club and/or committee roles.
- Greater attendance at second round of COT some clubs no officers attended.

Division Realignment: with the closure of Taieri & Oamaru clubs Division C currently has 15 clubs. Following the approval of the D72 realignment for the 2023-24 toastmaster year Division C will see five clubs moved into the division – Westport, Greymouth, Everest, Alpine & Ashburton bringing the club total to 20 clubs. This will not diminish the challenge the division has in terms of geography however Zoom and other platforms will support future area director visits.
