The District has 94 clubs. This is made up of:

78 paid-up clubs

5 clubs with low membership

2 ineligible clubs

Membership across the Divisions:

Membership continues an upward trend across the Divisions, with 87 new members between January and March 2024 and 635 new members across the District between July 2023 and March 2024.

The above graph shows the number of club members between August 2023 and March 2024.

Changes in the two months - January 2024 and March 2024, clubs with:

20+ membership has increased by 7 clubs (from 16 to 23 clubs).

16-20 members have a decrease of 1 club.

13-15 members show a reduction in 4 clubs.

12 or fewer members, the number of clubs in this category has been reduced by two clubs. However, this could be in part due to the club closures.

Club Coaches

The number of clubs eligible for coaches remains high at 33. As previously reported, two members were assigned as club coaches. We have one club coach sitting in the wings, ready to support a club within the district – but we do need more members ready to step into the role!! It's a vital role and counts towards your DTM.

Marketing:

A marketing campaign ran from 25 February to 10 March, using Billstickers. Large posters were scattered throughout various sites across the main cities and rotated around sites each week – Wellington, Christchurch, and Dunedin – see a sample of areas below.

The approach was twofold: advertising on LinkedIn plus print media; however, it was discovered that although the district has a LinkedIn account, it was created by past members who are no longer with the district, and we could not upload advertisements then.

Other resources available have been pens with the District motto of Next Step to your Goals. Clubs should have received these through their Area Directors or Division Directors. If your club has not received any pens, please let me know. I have a small number still available that I am happy to send.



A small amount of funding from club growth has been set aside to support struggling clubs with a membership of 12 or less. The funding is intended to help these clubs with their online advertising for an open/demonstration meeting during April to attract and sign-up new members. The clubs selected must meet strict criteria, for example, set a date to hold an open/demonstration meeting, have club financials of less than \$500, and demonstrate what advertising methods they have tried etc. Online resources (e.g., marketing templates and pamphlets) are available on the NZT website to support this initiative which will also be available for all clubs to use either in social media or print format.

Adapting to change projects: Note that some of these projects were delayed due to people's personal commitments, and some will be rescoped to ensure the work is not lost.

I wish to thank you all for your support during this Toastmasters year. We have an amazing group of people across the district. I have witnessed this through the training and district contests and look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at the conference in Dunedin in May. I wish you all the best in your continued Toastmasters journey.
