**CEO**, Animation Research Limited

#### Creating Creativity from Outside the Field of Play

Being the CEO of one of Australasia's leading Computer Graphics production houses, seemed an unlikely career choice for Cheryl Adams when she was grubbing thistles on her parent's farm. After all, she was going to be an accountant, until a calculus teacher suggested she'd get bored and advised her to head to engineering school. Cheryl will share her journey from mechanical engineer to award-winning computer graphics and empathetic people leader. We'll hear about how to create a space for innovation and what happened when things didn't go so well! Cheryl lives on a 'no-lifestyle block' above Carey's Bay in Dunedin's beautiful West Harbour with her partner, two teenage sons and four chooks.

#### DR IAN GRIFFIN

Director, Tühura Otago Museum

#### Adventures in Astronomy

lan Griffin completed his PhD in Astronomy at University College London and spent over 20 years leading cultural institutions around the world. In 2013 Ian was appointed as the 8th director of Otago Museum and, understanding the important role a museum can play in inspiring the next generation, oversaw the development of the Museum's science centre and planetarium. When Ian witnessed his first aurora australis in Dunedin, this started a passion for photographing the night skies. Ian will take the audience on a photographic tour of the night skies with some tales of his adventures in capturing the perfect image. In 2015 Ian was awarded the Prime Minister's Science Media Communication Prize and in 2019 was made a Companion of The Royal Society Te Apārangi.

#### **MAREA COLOMBO**

#### Thinking on your Feet: a Workshop in Spontaneity

Marea Colombo has been making things up for as long as she can remember. This skill has led her to be the Artistic Director of Improsaurus, an Ōtepoti-based improvisation troupe. Her PhD in social psychology investigated how we can "see through other people's eyes," and she loves intertwining both her academic and creative sides. Colombo is the co-creator of multi-award-winning company Late Bloomers, a production company which creates unique pieces of art. Marea's educational will teach a lesson in spontaneity and help you to overcome the mental barriers we face when speaking on the spot. You will not want to miss this opportunity to learn from such a brilliant performer and academic.

#### **JONATHAN USHER**

#### The Magic of Comedy

Jonathan Usher became hooked on magic when he saw a trick performed at a Christmas party in 1999. Fascinated by the method and its effect on the audience, he tried the trick on his workmates. One trick developed into a repertoire of tricks and soon his magic and humour was a hit with children and parents alike. Usher now performs at over 150 events per year all over New Zealand and Australia. In 2021 Usher cleaned up the awards at the New Zealand Magicians convention winning Best Comedy Magician; Best Performance of the Convention, and Best Performance in the evening Gala Show. In 2022 the Variety Artists Club of New Zealand awarded Usher the prestigious Variety Artist of the Year. In this entertaining educational you will see how you can use humour in your speaking and what to do when things go wrong.

#### **LOVEY RATIMA-RAPSON**

#### **Empowering Voices in Te Reo**

Lovey Ratima-Rapson has spent over two decades working in various sectors of the healthcare industry, primarily focused on Māori Health. Lovey's background in a diverse range of health settings, and her present role managing a team of Health Relationship Managers in Otautahi/Christchurch, has given her the experience and passion to support whānau. Lovey has held roles such as Club President and VP Education over her past seven years as a Toastmaster. Lovey will speak about how we can support members to engage and improve relationships.



#### The Game of Toastmasters

Karen Hoyland has an accounting background and a love of board games, so when she was introduced to the board game 'The Game of Business' she was naturally inspired to adapt the game from a business perspective to Toastmasters. Karen wants to inspire the audience to think outside the box when looking for new members, and to encourage committees to be more proactive about membership growth.
